Subject Information

A level Spanish builds on the knowledge and skills achieved at GCSE, allowing you to express yourself clearly and fluently in the target language. We will study a range of topics, including literature and film study, which will allow you to deepen your cultural and linguistic knowledge of the language. You will also have the opportunity to build on your research skills through exploring a topic of your choice to further deepen your curiosity and understanding of Hispanic language and culture.

Career Pathways

As a linguist, you will be highly sought after in a number of positions, and languages are seen very favourably by many universities. You may choose to combine your language with another subject and work in almost any profession in a Spanish speaking country. Other career pathways include: interpreter, translator, teacher, flight attendant, bilingual PA and diplomacy.
